REPORT: 1st Inter – Department Script Writing Competition

Date: 7th February, 2024

On 7th February, The Legal Aid and Pro Bono Club of ICFAI Law School, The ICFAI University Jaipur successfully organized the first edition of Inter- Department Script Writing Competition. It was organized by the Faculty Coordinator Dr. Pratima Soni (Associate Dean ICFAI Law School Jaipur) and Mr. Ashish Acharya, Ass. Prof. ILS, Jaipur. The competition was aimed to encourage creative expression among participants on crucial social issues.

The competition provided a platform for participants to express their thoughts and ideas through script writing. The theme of the competition revolved around three significant societal issues: Child Marriage, Drug Abuse, and Cyber Stalking. Participants were required to adhere strictly to the assigned theme and present their narratives within the specified time frame of 2:30 PM to 4:00 PM.

The competition welcomed individual entries or teams with a maximum of four members. Participants were instructed to keep their scripts concise, within a character limit of 8-10, and could choose to write in either Hindi or English. It was emphasized that the use of electronic means during the competition was strictly prohibited to ensure fairness and integrity.

To uphold the integrity of the competition, Originality and adherence to the assigned theme were set as key criteria for judging, along with creativity, coherence, and grammar. The decision of the judges, comprised of distinguished faculty members, shall be deemed final and indisputable.

Furthermore, by participating in the competition, participants granted the Legal Aid & Pro Bono Club the right to publish their stories on appropriate platforms such as the club's newsletter or promotional materials.

The competition witnessed enthusiastic participation from students across different departments of the university. There were total 145 participants in which we have 50 teams as group entries (Max 4 person in group) and 20 teams as Individual entries. The event served as a platform for budding writers to showcase their talent and raise awareness about pressing social issues.

Overall, the Inter-Department Script Writing Competition was a resounding success, fostering creativity, critical thinking, and social awareness among participants.
