Event Structure

1 ■ Welcome and Orientation

- Students were guided through the login process and the mechanics of virtual trading.

2 □ Trading Session

- Trading followed **NSE market hours**, beginning at 9:30 AM.
- Participants executed **buy/sell trades**, tracked price movements, and built strategies.
- Volunteers supported participants with technical queries throughout.

- Organizers explained concepts like scalping, short selling, and trading indicators.
- Senior student traders shared recommendations and strategies, offering peerlearning opportunities.

4 □ Leaderboard and Peer Sharing

• A live leaderboard created excitement and healthy competition.

• Top performers were invited to share their strategies, allowing participants to learn from different trading approaches.

Learning Objectives

Event Outcomes

Feedback Analysis

A structured feedback survey was conducted post-event to assess effectiveness.

1. Overall Experience

- 71.4% rated it Excellent
- 21.4% rated it Good
- 7.1% rated it Average
 Overwhelmingly positive reception.

2. Usefulness of StockGro Platform

- **52.4%** found it *Very Helpful*
- **38.1%** found it *Somewhat Helpful* ∜Platform proved highly effective, with minor scope for better guidance.

3. Clarity of Trading Concept Explanation

- **76.2%** rated it *Very Informative*
- 19% rated it Somewhat Informative
 Sessions were largely clear and insightful.

4. Volunteer and Team Support

- **69%** rated support as *Excellent*

5. Difficulty Level

Majority found it Moderate; some marked Easy, while a few found it Challenging.
 Balanced difficulty level but beginners may benefit from extra guidance.

6. Technical Difficulties

- **59.5%** reported *No Issues*
- 33.3% faced Occasional Issues

7. Interest in Stock Market

- **83.3**% said *Yes, Definitely*
- **14.3**% said *It piqued their interest* ∜Event successfully increased curiosity in financial markets.

The **Wall Street Simulation** proved to be an **engaging**, **practical**, **and impactful event**, successfully introducing students to the world of trading.
