

Report on Training Program on Art of Mooting and Case Analysis Competition

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The Moot Court Committee, ICFAI Law School, The ICFAI University, Jaipur has successfully organized a Training Program on the Art of Mooting followed by a Case Analysis Competition, exclusively for the first-year students under the guidance of the Faculty Coordinator, Ms. Chhaya Sikarwar. The event was conducted with the objective of familiarizing the freshers with the fundamentals of mootng and developing their legal research and analytical skills.

The program commenced with a formal session conducted by the Moot Court Committee, where the members introduced themselves and briefed the participants about the significance of moot courts in legal education. The session began with an explanation of what a moot court is, its importance in shaping a law student's career, and how it provides a practical insight into court proceedings.

The committee members further elaborated on the essential components of mootng namely speaking skills, legal research, and drafting of memorials. They explained how effective articulation, structured research, and well-drafted arguments form the backbone of a successful moot court presentation.

To make the session more interactive and enriching, senior students who had previously represented the university in various National Moot Court Competitions shared their experiences. They highlighted the challenges, learning outcomes, and personal growth that come with participating in moot court activities. Their insights provided the first-year students with motivation and a clear perspective on how mootng could enhance their academic and professional journey.

Following the conclusion of the training program, the much-awaited Case Analysis Competition was conducted. This competition aimed at testing the participants' ability to interpret facts, identify legal issues, and apply relevant laws logically. A remarkable level of enthusiasm was shown by the first-year students, and a total of 41 teams actively participated in the competition. For the competition, three landmark judgements were provided to the participants and one judgement was selected on the day of the competition and each team must

write on the same . Each team demonstrated commendable effort, analytical thinking, and presentation skills, making the event highly competitive and engaging.

It proved to be an invaluable experience for the participants, laying the groundwork for their future involvement in national and international moot court competitions. The event concluded with an appreciation of the participant's zeal and a note of encouragement from the Moot Court Committee, urging students to continue engaging in such academic exercises for their overall growth as budding legal professionals.
